**MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING**

The minute of the previous meeting was read and its acceptance was proposed Ms L McFarlane seconded by Mr T Woodford

**POLICE & FIRE**

Sgt Andrew Ness from Tayside Police was present at the meeting.

He reminded those present to report any suspicious activity to the police.

There were no reported crimes in the Community Council area.

In the wider Carse area there were incidents involving fuel being stolen from storage tanks and quad bikes being stolen from farms.

The thefts from cars in St Madoes & Errol have been detected, a reminder was given to ensure that valuables are kept secure and vehicles and buildings are kept locked.

A suspicious vehicle was reported in Glamis Crescent Inchture.

There are still a few issues with youths. Attempts are still ongoing to organise a youth club but accommodation problems are delaying this.

**TREASURER**

The accounts were distributed and agreed.

It was agreed that A Ramsay would draft a letter outlining the council's views on the wind turbines on the opposite side of the Tay.

**BRAES OF CARSE GROUP**

There is no immediate threat to the tall poplars at the east end of Wester Ballindean Orchard. 3 trees are to be planted for every removed poplar

There is one non-contentious application in Millhill.

S Kelly-Barton is to contact Douglas Calderwood to see if there are any other sources of funding for the bird box project.

### **ROADS AND TRANSPORT**

No reply has been received to the letter to P&K with regard to comments received from residents about gritting during the bad weather.

A letter was received from Dave Stubbs regarding the core paths, asking for comments from the council on the paths in our area. One in particular referring to the Mains of Inchtute requires a comment. It is through the Muir Homes part of the village and appears to be acceptable. The real problem are contentious paths around Kinnaird which have almost all been removed, leaving a situation where it will be impossible to go on a circular walk beyond Kinnaird.

Next event is a 'Dejeuner sur l'herbe' buffet lunch at 12.30 pm on Sunday, 5th June at Outfield Farm, Abernaye (following a short AGM at 12 noon). Tickets are £10 for adults and £5 for children.
