MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

The minute of the previous meeting was read and its acceptance was proposed Mr T Woodford seconded by Ms L McFarlane

POLICE & FIRE

No-one from Tayside Police was present at the meeting.

TREASURER

The funds currently stand at £470.94 The Special Project Fund has a balance of £10,137.13 including the £10,000 award from Big Lottery for the ICSC consultants report.

INCHTURE COMMUNITY FUND PANEL (ICFP)

The next meeting will be held on Monday 27th June. At this time there is only expected to be one application for funds. This will be from The Inchture Rainbows and is likely to be approved unanimously.

There is around £15,000 still available to be distributed.

INCHTURE COMMUNITY SPORTS COMPLEX

A meeting took place on Tuesday 24th May to discuss the final version of the feasibility study.

The meeting was attended by members of ICSC committee, representatives of PKC and John Eady, chief executive of KKP Consultants.

The meeting lasted for 2 ½ hours and the outcome was that despite the report saying that the project was viable, the committee members arrived at the conclusion that it could not go ahead in any of the ways suggested by KKP due to the lack of upfront funding to build the facility.

The next meeting is scheduled for Monday 6th June to discuss the way forward from here. Representatives of a company called DOE Sports will be attending the meeting to present a proposal to have a facility which has a canopy over one of the pitches.

PLANNING

There is a proposal to have a permanent site for travellers somewhere within Perthshire. The exact location has still to be decided on.
